


Percentage of children (<16yr) living in families in receipt of out of work benefits or tax credits where their reported income is less than 60% of median income, 2009



Comments

• Both Hammersmith and Fulham and Westminster have a higher proportion of children living in poverty than London and England. Child poverty in Kensington and Chelsea is significantly lower than London but higher than England

• Areas of deprivation, such as Church Street and Queen's Park in Westminster, North Kensington, and White City and Shepherd's Bush in Hammersmith and Fulham, all fall into the highest 20% in London for child poverty

• There are also a number of other pockets of child poverty spread throughout the three boroughs
