




Homelessness




Comments

- Across the three boroughs, there were 1,298 households accepted as homeless during 2011/12. There have been greater numbers in Kensington and Chelsea and Westminster than in Hammersmith and Fulham
- The number of households accepted as homeless rose by over 30% between 2010/11 and 2011/12
- Kensington and Chelsea has a significantly higher homelessness rate per household size than the London average. Westminster's is also higher
- The trend over time in Hammersmith and Fulham has been a similar rate to England, consistently lower than the London rate

Comments

- Across the three boroughs there were 4,313 households in temporary accommodation during 2011/12
- The number of households accepted as homeless rose by almost 15% in the last financial year
- Both Westminster and Kensington and Chelsea had a significantly higher proportion of households living in temporary accommodation than the London average
- In Hammersmith and Fulham the trend has been similar to the London national trend but was still significantly higher than England's
