

Deaths and serious injuries occurring on England's roads per 100,000 resident population, average during 2008-10



Comments

• There were 340 hospital admissions occurring in the tri-borough area in 2010. Many of these are for people visiting the three boroughs rather than living there

• The rate in Westminster is twice as high per population size than the London and England averages, which reflects the popularity of the borough for daytime visitors and the nature of the road network in Central London. Around 6 Westminster residents die each year from road traffic accidents, with no deaths among under 18s in the last three years

• Hammersmith and Fulham and Kensington and Chelsea also have higher rates than is typical for London and England, also reflecting their Central London position. Around 3 residents die each year from road traffic accidents in each of the boroughs, with 1-2 deaths among under 18s in each borough in the last three years



Comments

• The number killed or seriously injured on the boroughs' roads appears to have been dropping over time across all three boroughs over the last three years

• In particular, there has been a substantial drop in numbers in Westminster, from 261 in 2009 to 186 in 2010
